A Message from J. Martin Westermeyer

This article this month isn't the usual type I write, but I wanted to update you on some changes in Worship and what will be happening during the Lenten Season.

As I write this, we are near the end of the Epiphany Season and will soon begin the Season of Lent on February 14, 2024. I wanted to keep you all in the loop how the Communion Schedule will be during the upcoming Lenten Season.

- We will celebrate Communion on Sunday, February 4, 2024 as usual on the first Sunday.
- We will again celebrate Communion by Intinction on Wednesday, February 14, 2024 during our Ash Wednesday Service @ 12:00 Noon. Ashes will also be offered at this Service.
- To celebrate the beginning of Lent, we will celebrate Communion on the First Sunday in Lent, February 18, 2024 during Sunday morning Worship.
- The next time to receive Communion during Worship will be Maundy Thursday, Service on March 28, 2024. As always, Communion will be celebrated on Easter Sunday, March 31, 2024.

As you can notice, we will NOT celebrate Communion on Sunday mornings throughout the Season of Lent.

As you may have noticed during Communion Services at Christmas Eve and on January 7, 2024, we celebrated Communion at the table and not on the altar. I would like to explain the reasons behind my decision:

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In Christianity, an *altar* has been a structure on which a sacrifice was offered. In the past, it would have been animals or other form of sacrifice. The *table* on the other hand has come from our understanding and tradition because we do not see Communion as sacrificial in any way. We also, see the Communion table in the same way we gather about the dining room or breakfast table in our homes for a meal to be shared with those we love.

For us, then, at St. John's UCC, the altar will be a place for the candles, the Bible (and in some churches, the Book of Worship) or any decorations or flowers for the season. And the table, then, will become the place where we place the elements and gather to celebrate Communion. If you have any questions or concerns, please feel free to contact me.

Mid-Week Lenten Programs/Service:

During the Season of Lent we will hold Mid-week Lenten Programs/Service beginning Wednesday, February 21, 2024 and conclude on Wednesday, March 20, 2024. Two times to meet will be offered each week to accommodate as many as possible. During the day, we will meet at 1:00 pm and the other will be at 6:00 pm. We will run for 1 ½ - 2 hours.

I have not worked all the details out at this time to what will be involved – but I would like to take time to begin and continue the Small Group or Cottage Meetings. This would involve some discussion and questionnaires to acquire data that would be used eventually to compile the Church Profile. There will also be some devotional time and/or discussion about religious topics. More details to come in Sunday bulletins and in the Weekly New Updates.

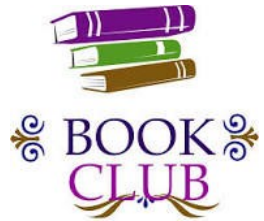


CHURCH BOOK CLUB - ALL ARE WELCOME!
